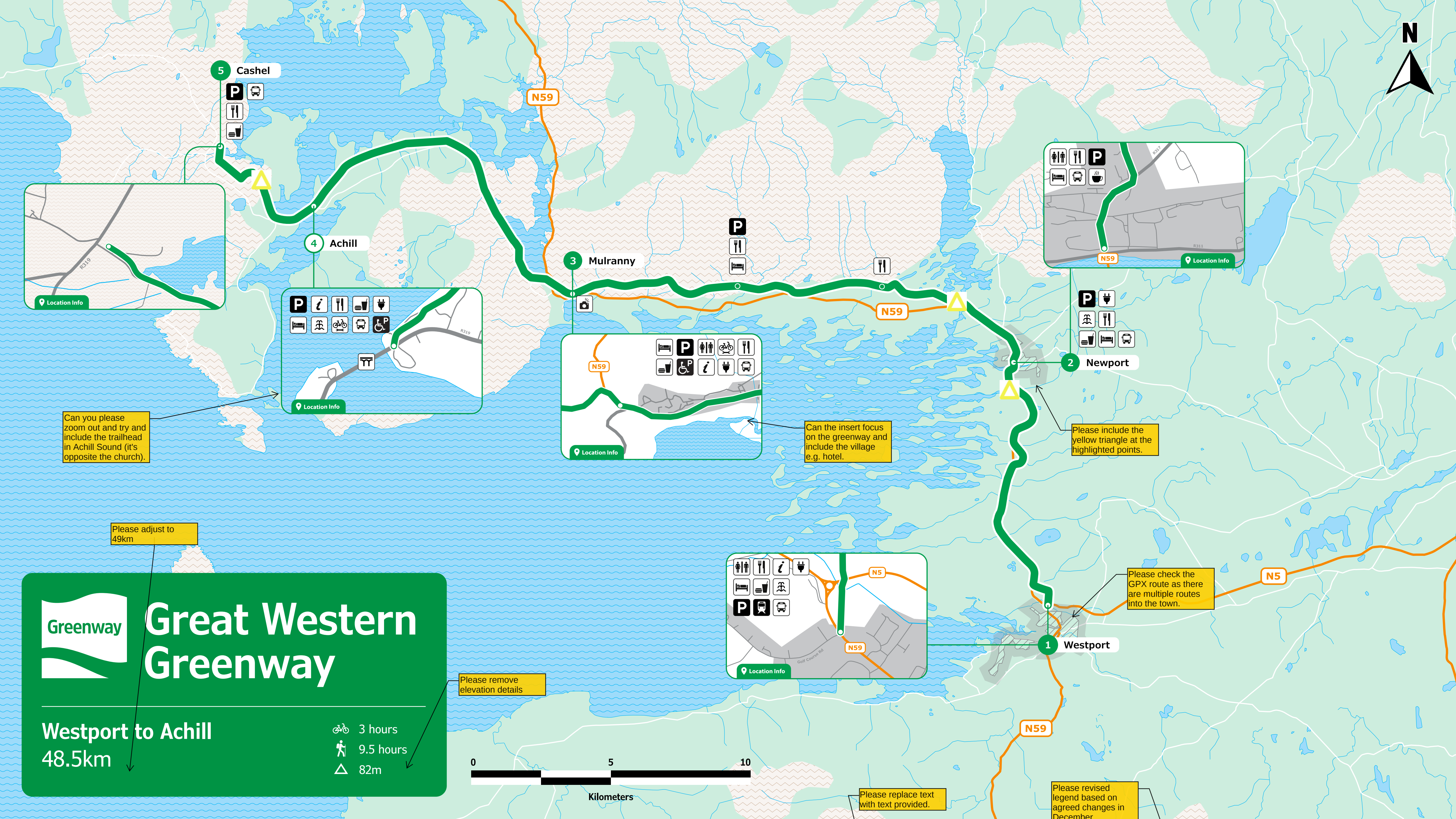

An official access point to the Greenway in Westport is located just off the N59, approximately 500 metres from the town centre when travelling in the direction of Newport—simply follow the directional fingerpost signs.

In Newport, access is found to the left off the N59, around 2 kilometres south of the town when heading towards Westport. This multi-use Greenway Trail Head is suitable for people with moderate levels of fitness, offering an off-road cycling and walking experience along a well-maintained route. The estimated time to complete the trail is 1 to 1.5 hours by bike or 3 to 3.5 hours on foot. Full services are available in both Westport and Newport.

In Newport, an official access point to the Greenway is located just off the N59 to the left when travelling in the direction of Mulranny.

In Mulranny, access is found to the right off the N59 when heading towards Bangor, with an additional access point to the rear of the Mulranny Park Hotel. This multi-use, off-road cycling and walking trail is suitable for people with moderate levels of fitness and takes approximately 2 to 2.5 hours to cycle or 5 to 5.5 hours to walk. The terrain is a dedicated Greenway, and services are available along the route in Newport, Derrada, Tiernaur and Mulranny.

In Mulranny, official access to the Greenway is available just off the N59 to the right when travelling towards Bangor, with an additional entry point located at the rear of the Mulranny Park Hotel.

On Achill Sound, access is available from the public car park in the village. This multi-use, off-road cycling and walking trail is suitable for people with moderate levels of fitness. The route takes approximately 1 to 1.5 hours to cycle or 3 to 3.5 hours to walk. Services are available in Newport, Mulranny, and Achill Sound.

On Achill Sound, official access to the Greenway is available from the public car park within the village, while in Cachel, access is provided from Ted's Bar and Restaurant.

This section of the Greenway features an off-road cycling and walking trail, including a 400-metre boardwalk. It is a multi-use route suitable for people with moderate levels of fitness, taking approximately 0.5 to 1 hour to cycle or 1.5 to 2 hours to walk. Services are available in Newport, Achill Sound, and Cachel.
